

## ANGOLA

**Jorge Addresses Nonaligned Delegates at UN**

[Text] In New York, Foreign Minister Paulo Jorge has in recent days discussed the political and military situation in the People's Republic of Angola at a time when imperialist forces are launching their attacks against our country with utmost intensity.

In a speech made at U.N. Headquarters to representatives of nonaligned countries participating in the 38th session of the United Nations, the Angolan foreign minister called on the international community to render material and financial support to Angola to enable it to counter the imperialist offensive. Thus, Comrade Paulo Jorge stressed the aggravation of tension in the southern region of the African Continent, particularly in our country, which is being attacked by the South African Army and destabilized by the criminal actions of the UNITA puppets.

Pretoria's aim of destabilization, by invading and occupying over the past 2 years a large part of Cunene Province, was once again condemned by Foreign Minister Paulo Jorge. He also pointed out that these external armed attacks and the acts of sabotage which completely destroy economic installations and (P)machines are part of the overall strategy of imperialism vis-a-vis southern Africa and most particularly a state which has opted for the socialist path of life, the People's Republic of Angola.

The Angolan foreign minister also stressed that the objective of the destabilization offensive is to install a neocolonial regime in Angola and thereby liquidate the process of the accession of Namibia to independence.

In his speech at the meeting of the representatives of nonaligned countries in New York, Comrade Paulo Jorge recalled that the last summit of the nonaligned countries held in New Delhi condemned the acts of aggression on and destabilization of Angola and called for the withdrawal of South African troops from its southern region. It also called for the application of U.N. Resolution 435 and the cessation of maneuvers aimed at conditioning the independence of Namibia to the withdrawal of the Cuban troops from Angola.

Foreign Minister Paulo Jorge gave an interview 2 days ago to several U.N. radio reporters in which he stressed the same points and reiterated the support of the Angolan people for the revolutionary vanguards of the Namibian and South African peoples, SWAPO and ANC, respectively.

We note that the Angolan foreign minister will address on 11 October the participants of the 38th U.N. session currently under way in New York.

The foreign minister will visit Portugal 13 and 14 October at the invitation of Portuguese Foreign Minister Jaime Gama. During the visit, which will start the day after the official visit of the Mozambique president to Portugal ends, Comrade Paulo Jorge

and Jaime Gama will discuss issues relating to relations between the two countries.

**Cuban Attorney General Begins 8-Day Visit**
